Gap Program

Supplemental assistance to cover the shortfall of current rental coverage such as FEMA Continued Temporary Housing Assistance (CTHA) & insurance.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Host Housing Support Program

Provides financial assistance to households offering housing to individuals and families displaced by the Maui wildfires.

Depending on the size of the family you host: \$500/person/month up to a maximum of \$2,000/month for a family of 4 or more.

ADU Loan Forgiveness Program

Homeowners with approved plans to build an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) and willing to host a displaced, fire-impacted family for up to three years can qualify for a \$50,000 forgivable loan.

Kahului Distribution Center

Open to those directly and indirectly impacted by the wildfires in need, donations of household goods and food is available.
